Honour for a "Friend of Muenster"

Faculty of Chemistry and Pharmacy gives the title of Honorary Doctor to Prof. Dr. Tatsumi

In a ceremony on Monday May 9 at the Westfalian Wilhelms University (WWU) the Faculty of Chemistry and Pharmacy has honoured the Japanese chemist Prof. Dr. Kazuyuki Tatsumi (Nagoya University) by electing him as Honorary Doctor. Prof. Dr. Jan Andersson, Faculty Dean for Education, presented the Citation Document. The Ceremony took place as part of a scientific colloquium of the German-Japanese "International Research Training Group" (IRTG) Muenster-Nagoya.

After an introduction by Prof. Dr. Gerhard Erker, Speaker of the IRTG Muenster-Nagoya, Prof. em. Dr. Bernt Krebs (Institute of Inorganic and Analytical Chemistry of the WWU) presented the Laudatio. He pointed out that Kazuyuki Tatsumi is honoured as one of the "leading scientists of Japan". In addition, he said that the Japanese chemist is internationally outstanding and, what is most important, "a friend of Germany and Muenster". He continued that, as a fortunate coincidence there is a second great honour for Kazuyuki Tatsumi: Still in this month he will receive in Berlin together with Gerhard Erker the Eugen and Ilse Seibold Award by the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft. The Laureates will be honoured "as outstanding communicators between Japan and Germany and as sustainable supporters of science".

Some years ago Kazuyuki Tatsumi has, together with Gerhard Erker (Professor at the Institute of Organic Chemistry at the WWU), successfully initiated the IRTG Muenster-Nagoya. This was the first German-Japanese Graduate College, financed by the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft and its Japanese counterpart, the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science. Within this extensive PhD student exchange program as part of the IRTG "Complex Chemical Systems: Design, Development and Applications" very successful cooperations between scientists of the Universities in Muenster and Nagoya have developed. Among the participating scientists is also the Nobel laureate Prof. Ryoji Noyori.

With the award of the Honorary Doctor the Faculty has acknowledged the internationally outstanding achievements of Kazuyuki Tatsumi in the field of organometallic chemistry and in the understanding of the role of metals in biological systems. In these fields of research the Japanese scientist has published an especially large number of groundbreaking publications. In addition, the longstanding successful activities of Kazuyuki Tatsumi for the improvement of international scientific relations are acknowledged. In this framework he has set new standards in the cooperation between Japanese and German Research Institutions.

As the laudator pointed out further, Professor Tatsumi (born 1949), besides his successful work as Director of the internationally leading Research Center for Materials Science at Nagoya University, has gained international acknowledgement for his outstanding activities in general science policy. At present he is Vice President and for 2012 he is President-Elect of the International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry, the World Top Organization of all National Chemical Societies.
